Dr. Daniel Hernández is an Associate Professor of Biology at Carleton College who studies the management and restoration of grassland ecosystems. A Kansas native, Dr. Hernández received his B.S. in Environmental Studies from the University of Kansas and Ph.D. from the University of Minnesota. His research and teaching are focused on undergraduate training and education, particularly of underrepresented groups in ecology and conservation. He has been involved in several programs to support underrepresented minorities, including as an instructor with the University of California Santa Cruz Doris Duke Conservation Scholars Program, an undergraduate training program designed to increase the diversity of leaders in the field of conservation.
